**December Meeting:** Our presentation at December's meeting was by Donna Shearer, founder and chairman of the non-profit organization, Save Georgia's Hemlocks. Donna is the 2012 winner of Atlanta's Cox Conserves Hero for the outstanding work she and her group are doing fighting the wooly adelgid which is destroying our native hemlocks throughout the Appalachian range. Donna gave an update on their efforts, as well as useful information for everyone who either has hemlocks on their property or wish to help in the fight. The good news is that the steps to treat trees, whether minimally, moderately or severely infected, is relatively cheap and easy to do.


Also, Steve Banakas mentioned there will be another work project on Fires Creek to dismantle the illegal dams that are built each year by campers. The date is TBD.
